## Where is this child eating?

Everyday Mean Sambo wakes up and many others like him only to walk to the city trash dump to search for food. They are starving, malnourished, in poor medical health, abandoned and living a life of refuse on the streets of Phnom Penh.

As horrifying as this seems to us in the United States, it is daily life for children like Mean Sambo. Surrounded by deplorable human conditions, these street children are left to fend for themselves.

They have no voice which cries out for help in Cambodia. It is only through the efforts of a few



and ASIA WORD these children find some semblance of hope, medical treatment, balanced and

nutritious meals, education and a safe environment to live.

However, the need is great and ASIA WORD needs help in rescuing and caring for children like Mean Sambo. ## A Cambodian Christmas Recipe



**A delightful  
Cambodian dessert!**

Num Chek Bok  
(Banana pounded cake)

Ingredients:

14 well ripened bananas  
250g of rice paddy flour  
250ml of coconut milk  
200g of minced palm sugar or  
250g of white sugar

Peel off the banana skins. Fine the bananas by using the header part of a big flat knife, tapping on bananas until they are fine.

Add the rice paddy flour,

coconut milk, sugar, and a little bit salt. Mix them well together. The coconut milk should add slowly. The mixture needs to be thick, not watery. If the mixture is too thick, then add some water. Sweeten to taste.

After all ingredients are put together (banana, flour, sugar, coconut milk), Num Chek Bok must be steamed in order to be cooked.

Using a steaming pan, pour the mixture in the aluminum mold for making the banana cakes.

On the stove, place a frying pan containing about 500ml of water, and then place a small dish at the middle. On the center dish place the mold on top. Then the frying pan must be covered. Steam for approximately 20 minutes. Pay attention to the water in the frying pan; add more water if it gets too dry. After Num Chek Bok is steamed cut into pieces for serving.
